Primary School PE Grant

For the past three years the Government has provided Primary schools with an additional grant for improving the participation and attainment of pupils in PE and Sports. At Cippenham Infant School, we were awarded £8,900 for the academic year 2015 – 16 and will be awarded the same for 2016-17. This funding which is ring fenced for investment in sport is given directly to schools to use as they wish for improving the quality of sport and PE. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

At Cippenham Infant School we use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that we school already offer
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

We use the funding to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training and resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running extending school sports and holiday clubs,
- run sport competitions
- run sports activities with other schools through the Slough Sports Network
