<p>For the past three years the Government has provided Primary schools with an additional grant for improving the participation and attainment of pupils in PE and Sports. This year the government has doubled the Sports funding and this year we will be receiving £17,800. This funding which is ring fenced for investment in sport is given directly to schools to use as they wish for improving the quality of sport and PE. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.</p>
